It will culminate with a series of outreach events strategically designed to share the love of Jesus with key groups of people in our community, including university students, business/civic leaders, women, and those who are incarcerated. Praise God! The Park City SummerFest Vacation Bible Camp, “Power Up”, held just one week ago, was a resounding success! Thanks to the connections made through CityServe, four faith based educational groups – FaithActs, Elevate, Faith & Education Coalition, and Rise to Read – came together with local congregations to bring not only the gospel, but bilingual educational opportunities free to over 100 children in Bridgeport, age 4 & up. Of these 100 children, half had no church affiliation, and so taking the camp to the public square had a far greater impact than a congregation hosting its own camp within its walls. Please offer your personal thanks to Pastor Marjo for her involvement in CityFest & CityServe, and to Jean Larson and all of the Salem volunteers she recruited, including Sandra Brown, Nancy Headford, and Bruce & Diane Tomasko!

UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Dominic, founder of the Dominicans, died 1221

Monday, August 8, 2022

Dominic was a Spanish priest who saw the wealth of the clergy as a stumbling block for the church, so he formed a movement, the Order of Preachers (commonly called Dominicans) devoted to itinerant preaching and living in poverty.

Lawrence, deacon, martyr, died 258

Wednesday, August 10, 2022

As one of the seven deacons of the church at Rome, Lawrence was responsible for the church's financial matters and for the care of the poor. Asked by the emperor to gather the church's treasure, he presented a collection of orphans, lepers, and the like. The enraged emperor had him put to death.

Clare, Abbess of San Damiano, died 1253

Thursday, August 11, 2022

A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, Clare and a growing number of companions established a women's Franciscan community, called the Order of Poor Ladies, or Poor Clares. She inspired other women to pursue spiritual goals.

Florence Nightingale, died 1910; Clara Maass, died 1901; renewers of society

Saturday, August 13, 2022

Nightingale was born in England, and horrified her wealthy family by deciding to become a nurse.

She led a group of nurses in ministering in the midst of the Crimean War, and worked for hospital reform.

Maass, a native of New Jersey, was also a war nurse, and volunteered as a subject for research on yellow fever. She died of the disease.



- Nearly 60% of those graduating from Bridgeport public schools are functionally illiterate


ADOPTION + FOSTER CARE



- New Haven County alone has over 1,200 children in need of foster families, and over 200 are sent to other counties to be cared for

Did you know that the prisons are built based on the reading scores of third graders? And that 76% of third graders in Bridgeport cannot pass their third grade literacy test? That was the impetus for Pastor Gabrielle Beam to found Rise to Read, in order to eradicate childhood illiteracy in Bridgeport and throughout the United States, thereby breaking generational curses and stopping the school-to-prison pipeline. Using the Bible as a primer, Rise to Read-trained volunteers provide free reading literacy education to primary school children in afterschool and Sunday School programs, and vacation bible camps.
